Map Overview






Below shows some of the key features of how to use the map to find information.






No.	What is this	What it does
1	Home button	Returns you to a full map of the state
2	Toggle Layer List button	When you click this the first time, it will show you the Layers tab, and which layers are showing. You can turn off these layers, or turn on more layers, by ticking the box to the right. Click on Legend to see how the layers are shown on the map.
3	Search Bar	Use this to search a specific address, landmark or suburb. Once you have entered in what you want to search, click on the magnifying glass to run the search 
4	Zoom button	Click on this button to zoom into an area
5	Information button	Click on this button to show information on the area you have selected
6	Expand map button	Clicking on this will expand the map so it is full screen




View your reserve/s on the map

No.	What is this	What to look for
1.	Click on View Our Reserves on Map on the I want to... selection list on the right of the screen.	 View Our Reserves on Map
2.	The map will show the reserve you manage.	
3.	Click on the Toggle layer list button from the left-hand side menu of the map.	
4.	<p>A list with two tabs will appear – Layers and Legend.</p> <p>The Layers list will show first, use this to tick or untick the layers you want to see.</p> <p>Click the Legend tab to see how what you have selected will appear on the map</p>	

No.	What is this	What to look for
5.	<p>From the Legend tab you can turn Aerial Photography to show your reserve on a satellite image (e.g. like Google maps).</p>	
6.	<p>To Zoom in to the reserve, click on the magnifying glass on the right hand side menu.</p> <p>Your mouse cursor will become a +. Click and hold the mouse down to draw a box. Unclick and the image will zoom in.</p> <p>You can also use the + button to zoom in and - button to zoom out. These are on the left-hand side menu.</p>	  
7.	<p>Use the NSW Administrative Boundaries layer and sublayers to view suburbs, electorates and county, parish labels of your reserve/s.</p>	

No.	What is this	What to look for
8.	Use the Crown Estate All layer and sublayers to show nearby Crown land such as parcels, roads and waterways.	
TIP	To hide the layer list, click the Toggle button again.	
TIP	<p>If you are a member of multiple Crown land managers, you can change the view in the top right-hand corner.</p> <p>Click on [Change] and select the Crown land manager you wish to view from the drop-down menu.</p> <p>The map will then change to represent that Crown land manager.</p>	

Using the map for basic searches

No.	What is this	What to look for
1.	Click on View Our Reserves on Map on the I want to... selection list on the right of the screen.	 View Our Reserves on Map
2.	<p>The map will show the reserve you manage.</p> <p>If you want to unselect this, click on the Toggle Layer List button, and then uncheck Managed Reserves.</p>	
3.	<p>To search a place or address, use the Search bar on the left-hand side menu.</p> <p>Type in the place or address and click on the Magnifying glass to search.</p>	
4.	<p>The map will display the place or address you have selected.</p> <p>You can use the layers as described above to view.</p>
